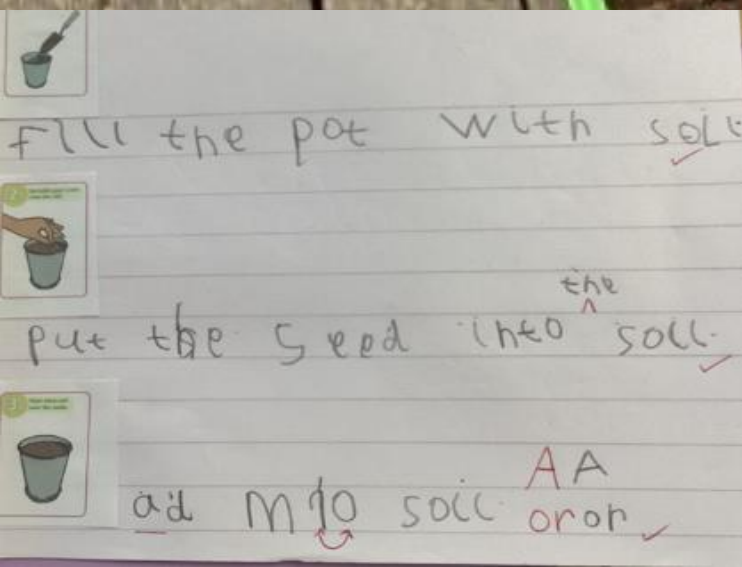




Year 1

Did you know sunflowers can grow up to 300cm or 400cm.

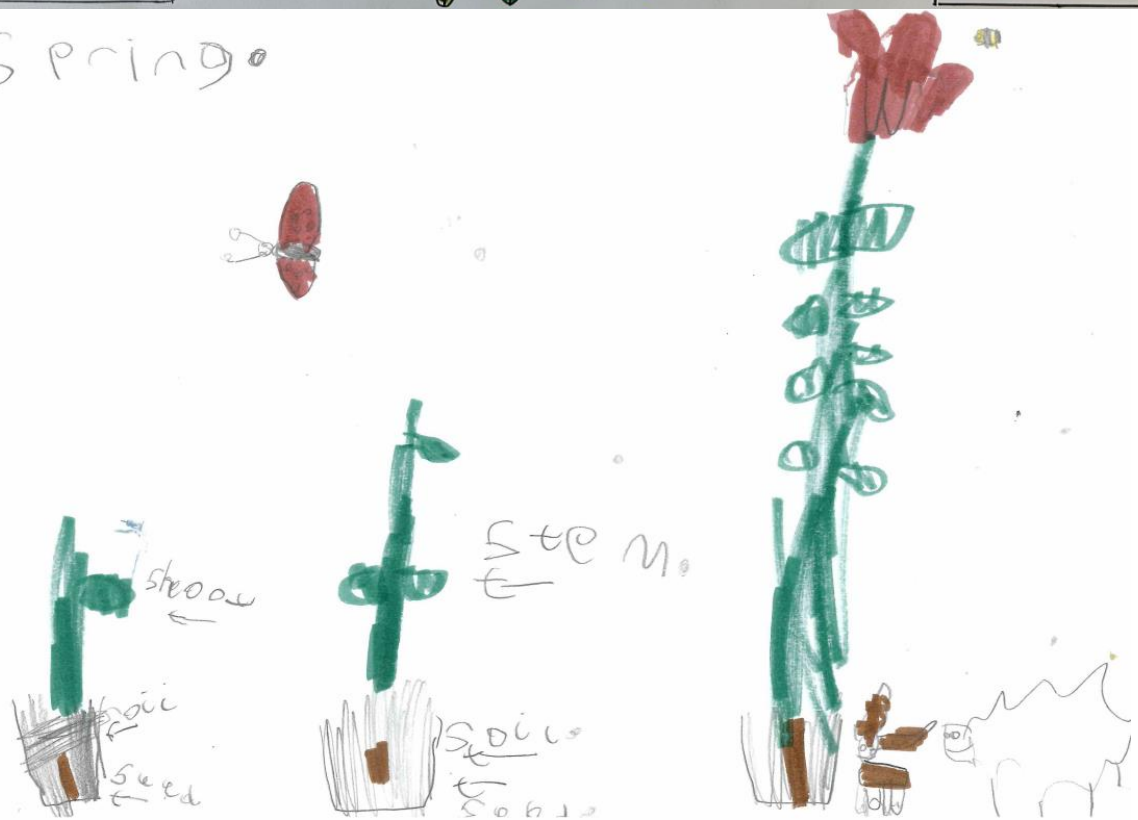

Year 3

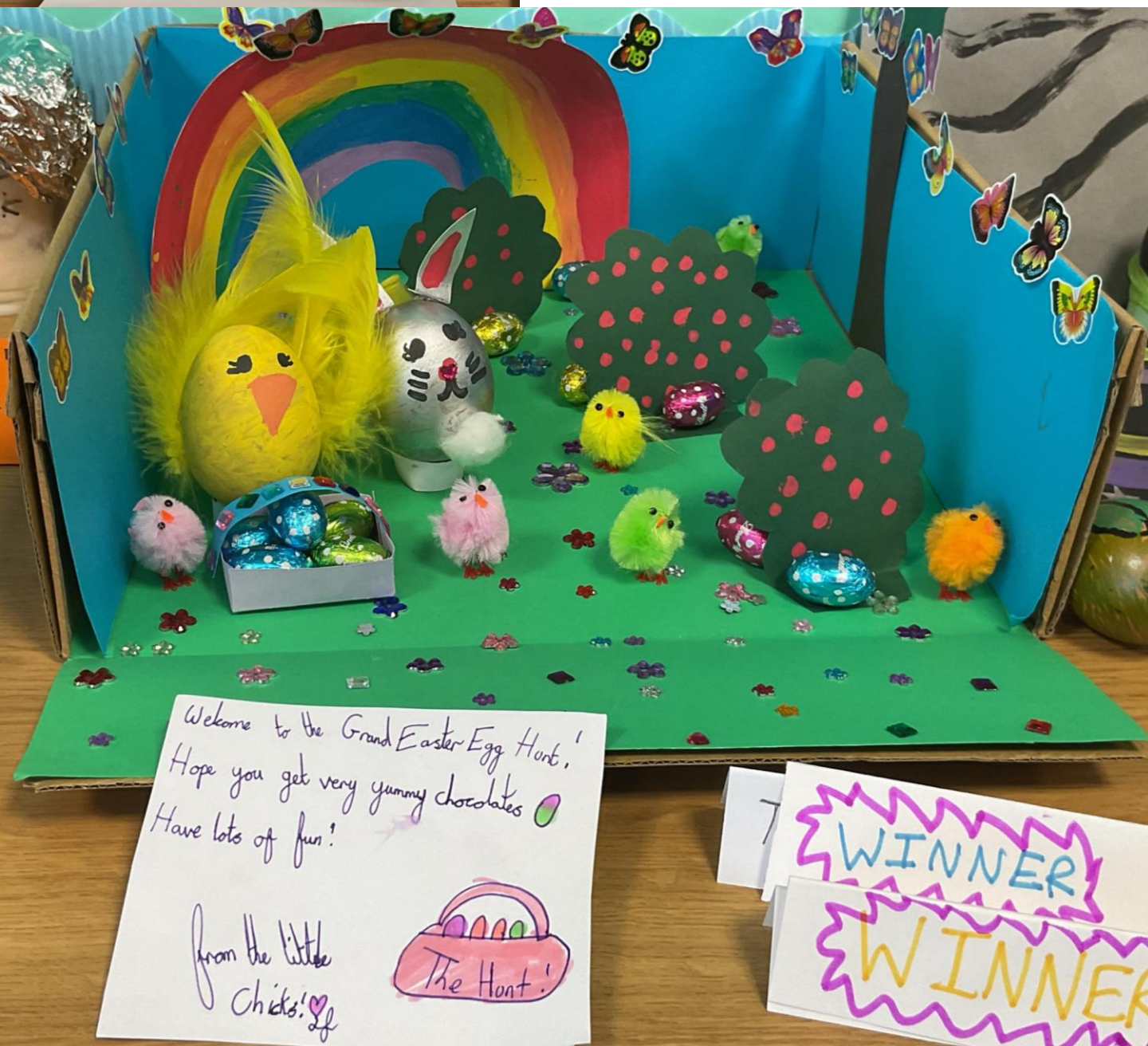

Sometimes the sun shines in spring.

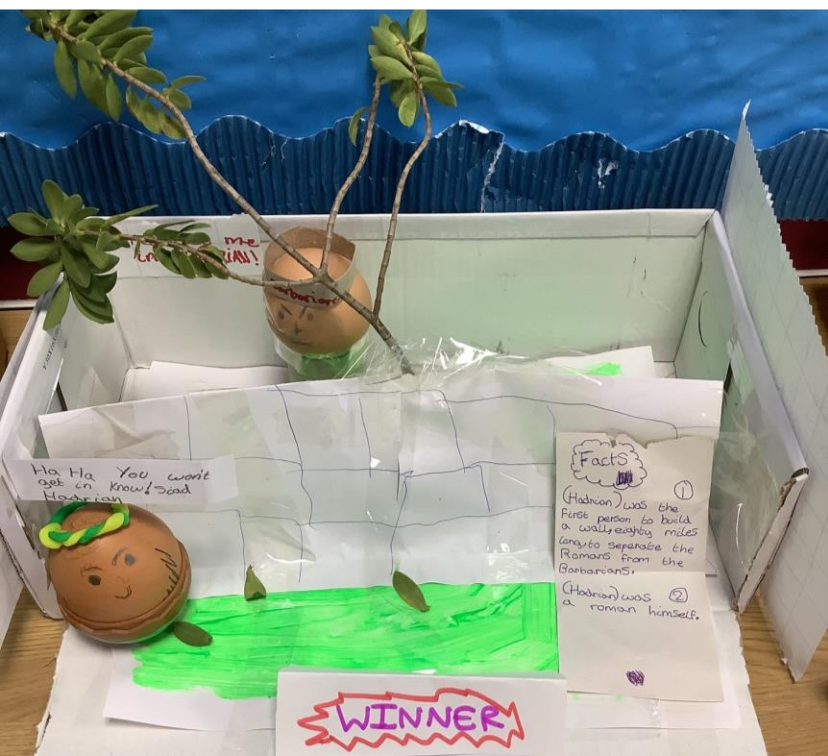
Year 5

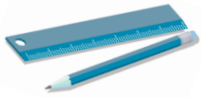

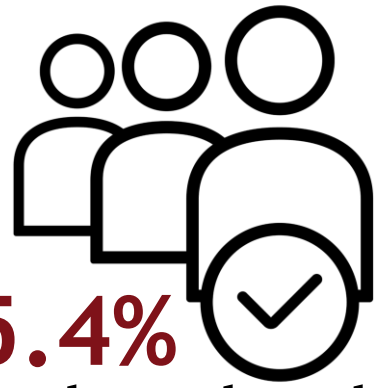
