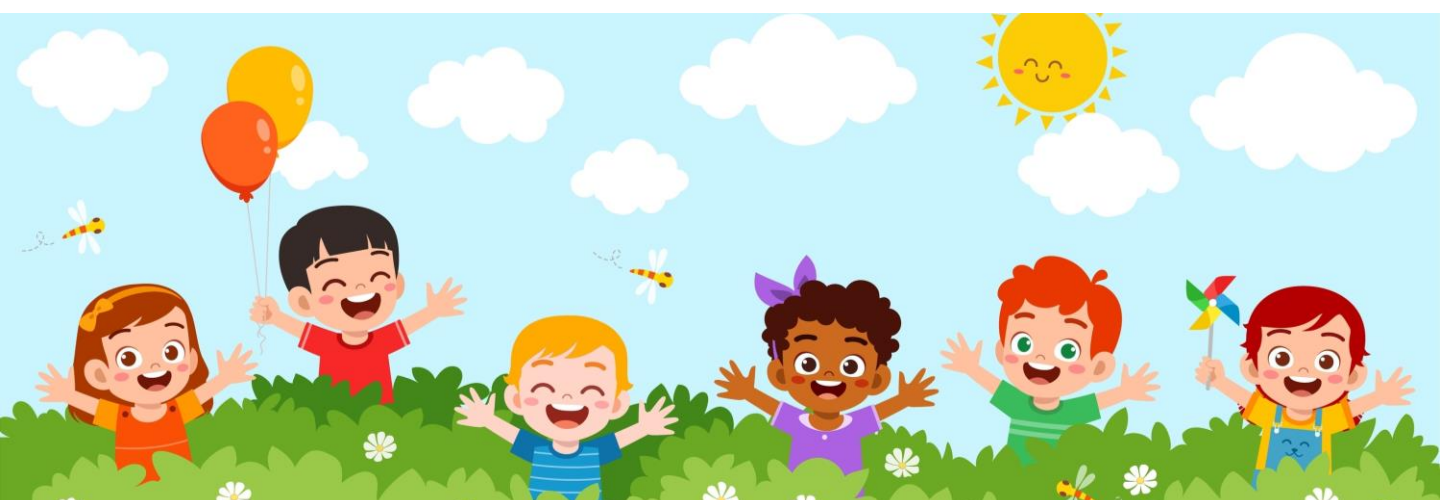

Year 1 News

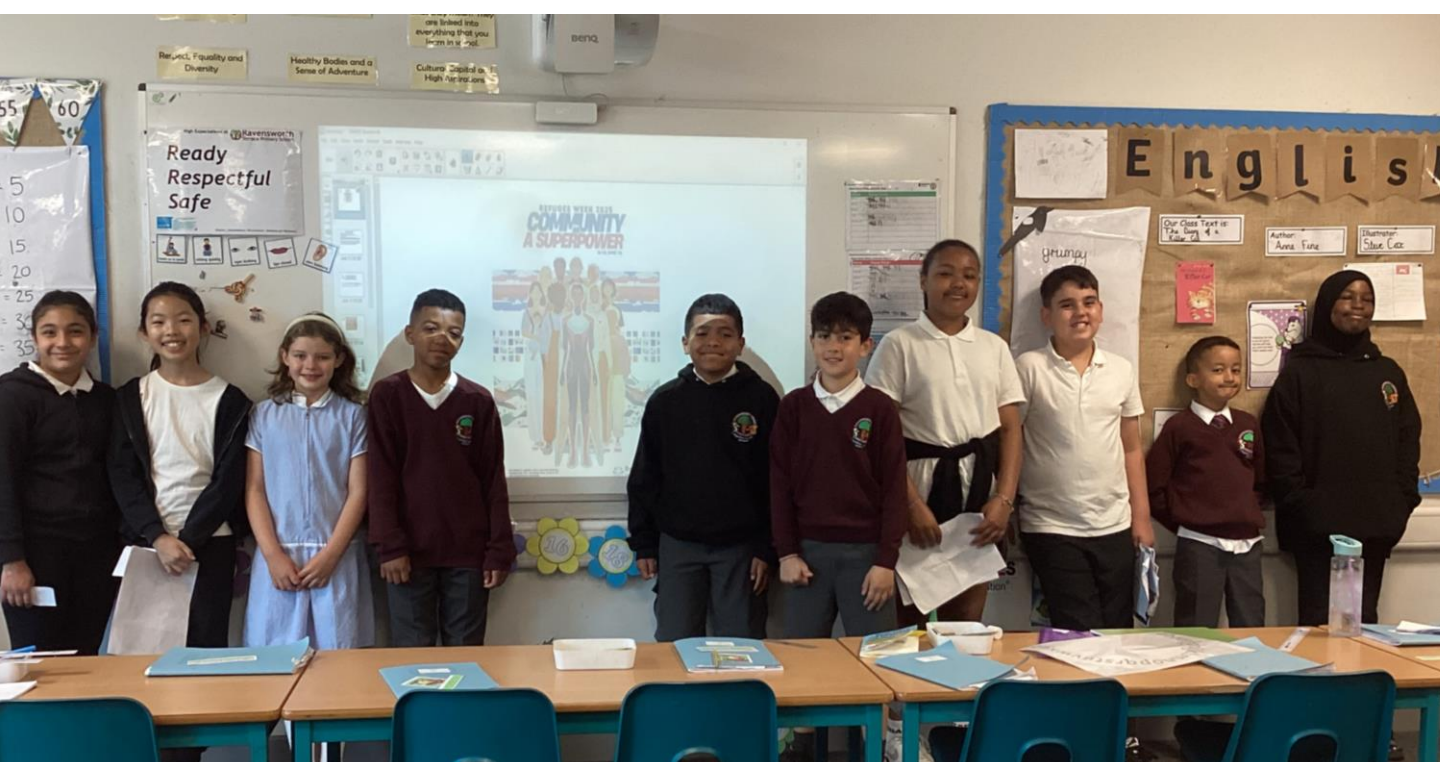

In Art, Year 2 have been exploring the form of flowers. They used clay and paper plates to create their own 3D roses.



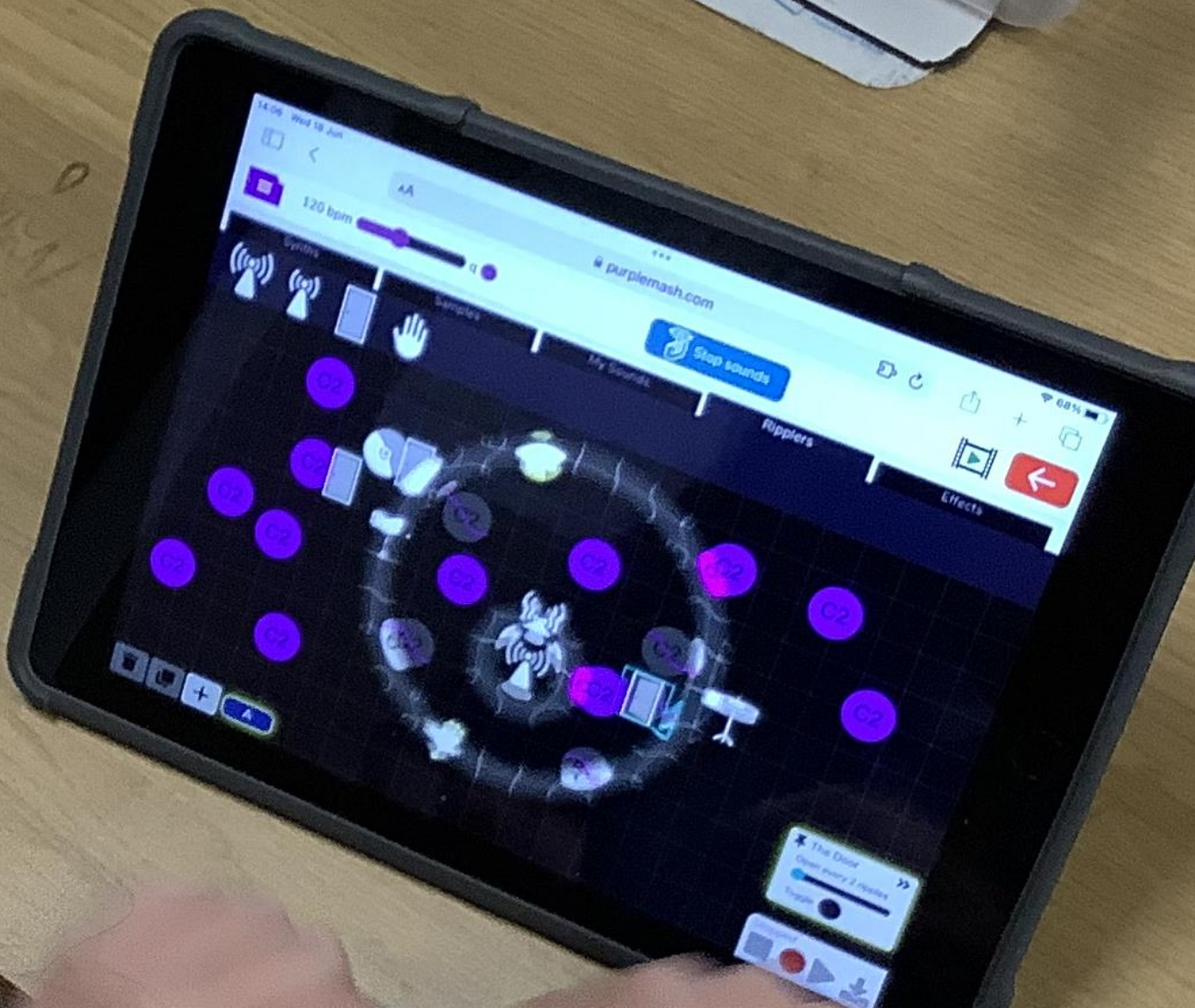
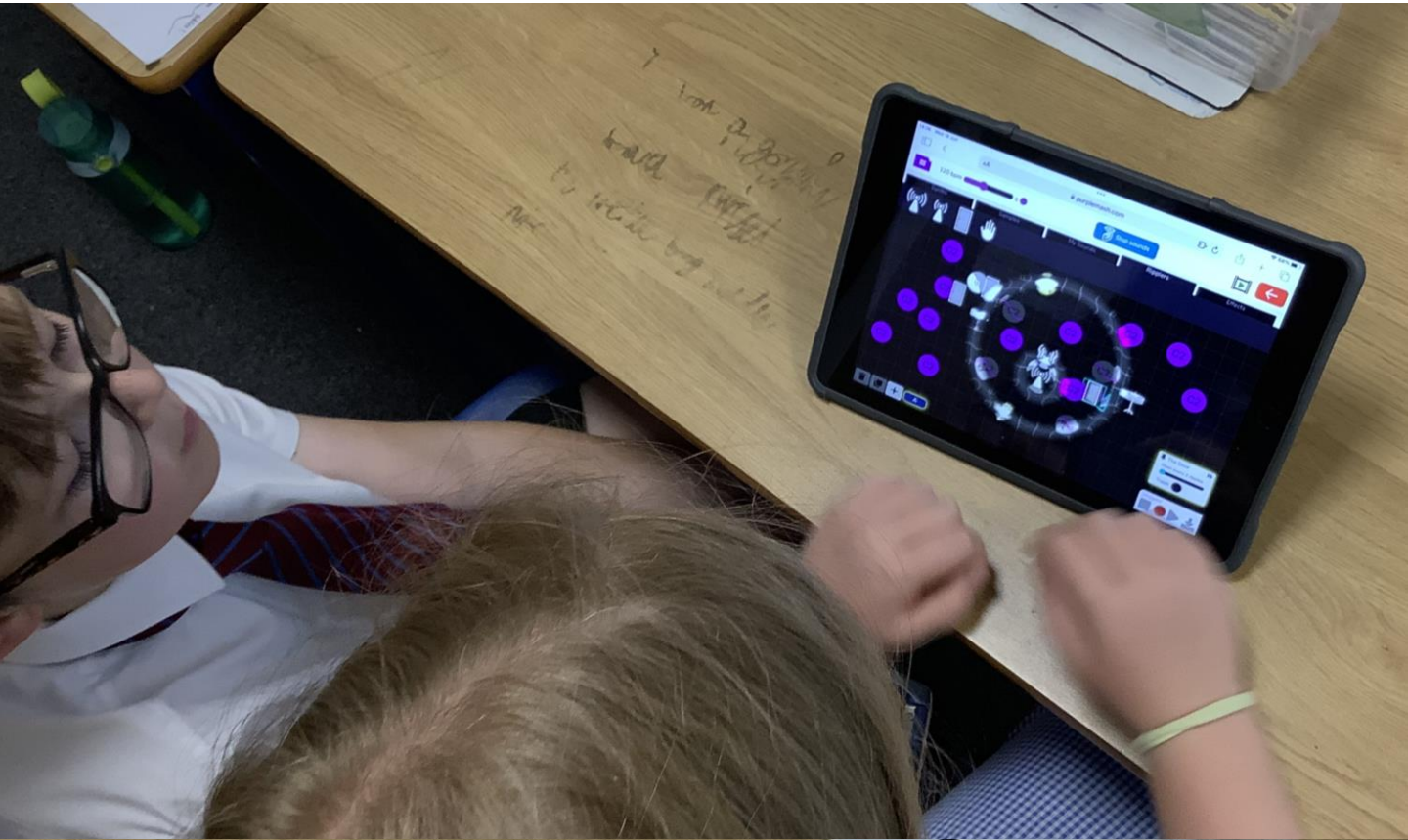
Year 3

This week in Computing we used the software to create our own melodies! We changed the pitch and tempo to create some impressive tunes!



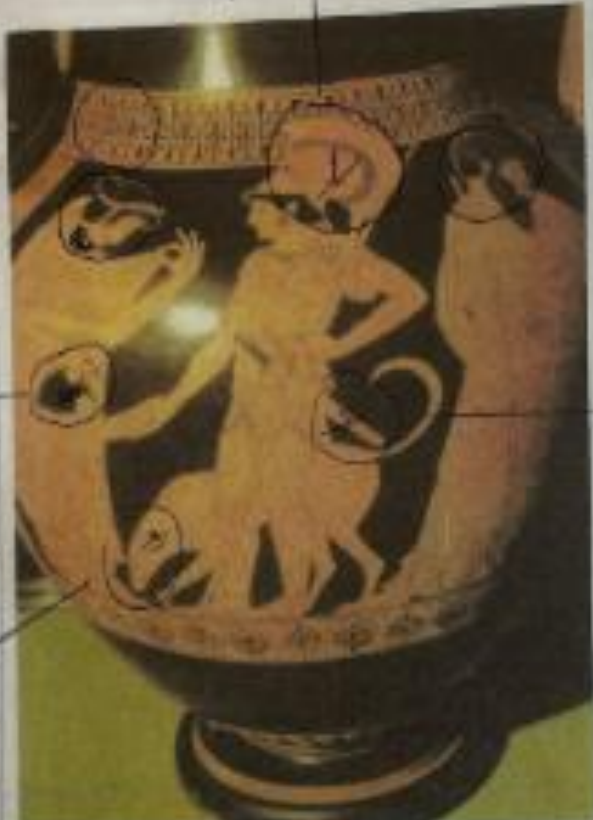
Year 5

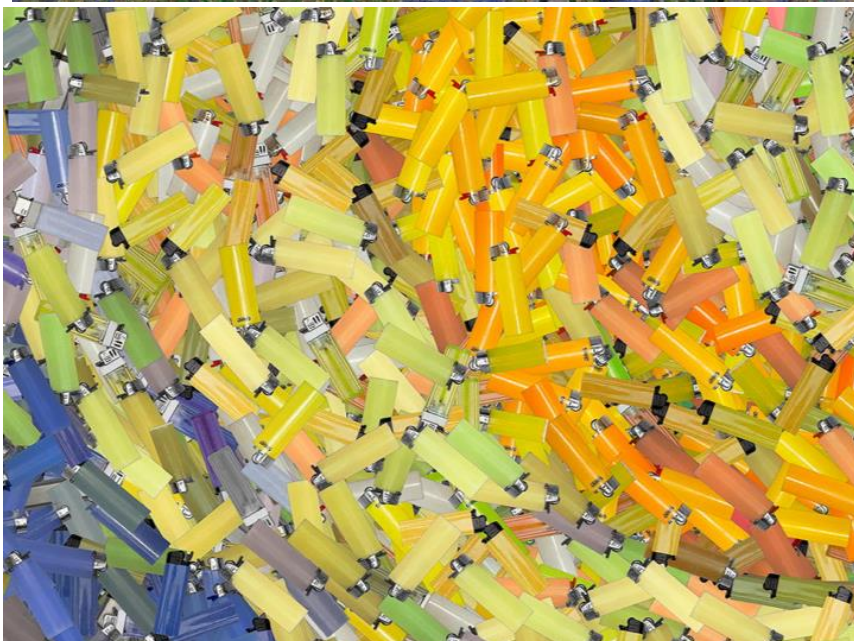
