We visited Segedunum last week and learnt loads about the Romans. We got to learn about the army and we threw plastic balls at and the Celts who were attacking us!



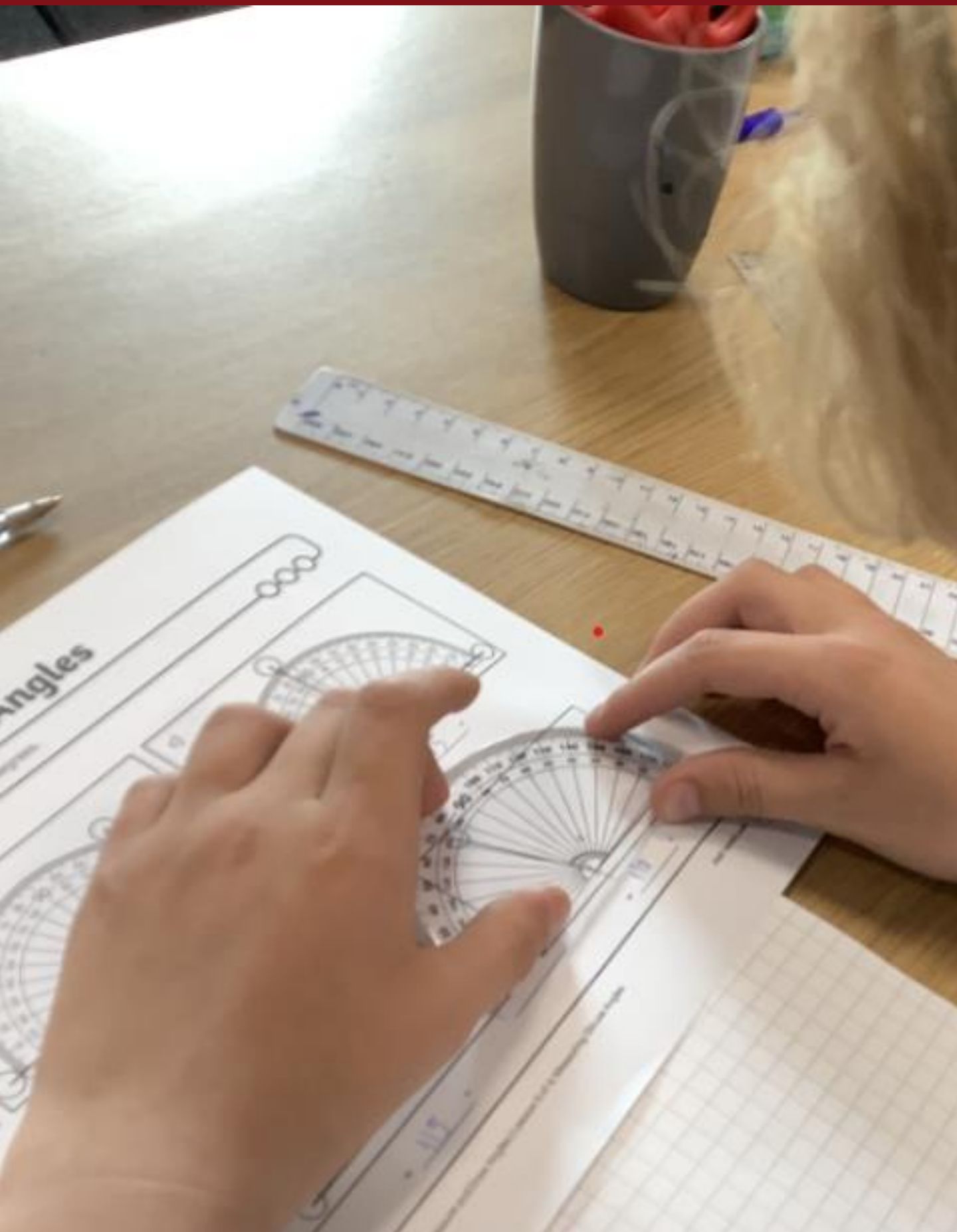
Year 4

Adolf Hitler

Adolf Hitler was the leader of the Nazi Party and a fascist dictator. He ignored the Treaty of Versailles and formed alliances with Italy and Japan

Treaty of Versailles

The Treaty made Germany take sole responsibility for the First World War, forbade them from having a large army and forced them to pay huge reparations.

Militarism

Adolf Hitler built up Germany's armed forces, which broke the terms of the Treaty of Versailles.

Appeasement

Britain and France let Adolf Hitler invade Austria and Czechoslovakia, hoping that this would satisfy him and avoid another war. Instead, he invaded Poland.

League of Nations

The peace-keeping organisation did not have an army of their own, and Britain and France ignored their advice about how to deal with Germany.

Fascism

Fascists believe that their country is better than all others. They put their country's needs before those of the individual, and believe that everyone should work together for the glory of the country.

Reparations

The reparations money that Germany was forced to pay damaged the economy in the early 1920s and left German people unemployed, starving and angry.

Great Depression

Germany had to pay back its loans to the United States during its Great Depression, which made unemployment and poverty worse in Germany.

Expansionism

The Axis Powers invaded and took over new land. Germany wanted to invade Czechoslovakia and Japan invaded China, and

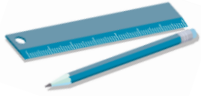

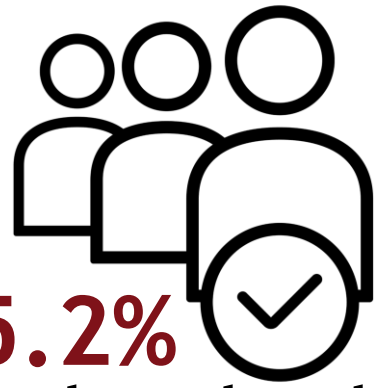

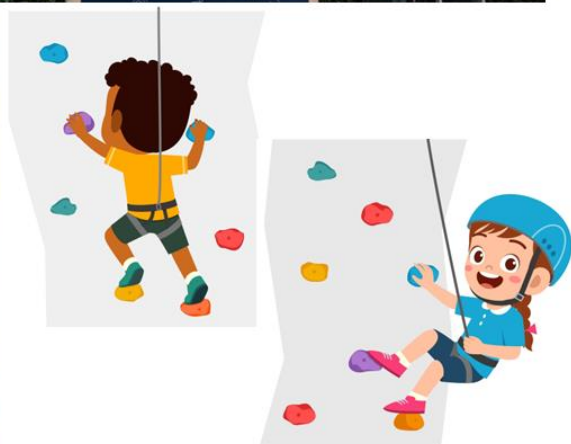
